1 PE and Sport Premium

Schools have a central role to play in supporting all children and young people to live healthy active lives. This is particularly true of primary school where the foundations of positive and enjoyable participation in regular physical activity should be established.

Crucial to achieving this is ensuring that pupils have access to at least 30 minutes of physical activity during the school day, alongside high-quality PE provision taught by confident and knowledgeable teachers and opportunities to experience and participate in a wide range of sports and physical activities.

The government provide PE and sport premium grant funding which SCPS use towards these aims.

2 How SCPS use this funding

SCPS uses the PE and sport premium funding to:

- build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now are sustainable and will benefit pupils joining the school in future years
- develop or add to the PE, sport and physical activity we provide

- The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement

4 Impact Details

Inter school competition will be a key focus for the school and many of the larger events will be centrally organised.

Pupils will be encouraged to participate to healthy and active games during their playtimes.

All pupils will be participating in at least one after school activity either initiated by the school, sign posted by the school or other.

If non-participation, this will be by choice and not through lack of finances.

All pupils will have access to all areas of the National Curriculum including opportunities for Outdoor Adventure education in both Key Stages.

All pupils will meet the expected outcomes of the End of Key Stage 2 swimming requirements.

All pupils in Key Stage 1 will receive a Forest School experience that is nationally accredited.
