## **KS2 Swimming donations**

We offer high quality support to our pupils to learn to swim by offering swimming lessons throughout Years 1 to 6. This is significantly more than most other primary schools are able to do. We employ our own swimming teachers who know the children well. Pupils are taught in small groups of less than 10. We place a particular emphasis on water safety.

Our ability to offer this level of support for swimming is dependent on having access to our onsite pool. However, the costs of operating this facility have increased substantially in recent years due to price increases for electricity, water and pool chemicals – all the stuff you need to run a pool! To help us continue to provide lifesaving swimming lessons for pupils in Years 4, 5 and 6, we are asking for a contribution of £12 per pupil for those year groups. The payment for this donation can be made on MCAS, in the 'Shop' area.
