


Milk Bottle Watering Can



 Coloured marker pens or acrylic paint



- 2. With a grown-up's help, push the wooden skewer or drawing pin into the lid on the bottle to make some holes. This is where the water will come out!
- 3. Use your skewer or drawing pin to poke one hole in the handle of the bottle. This will allow the air out.
- 4. Using the coloured marker pens or paint, decorate your bottle however you like. If you use paint, remember to give it plenty of time to dry after!
- 5. Fill your bottle with water and replace the lid.
- 6. Now, go and water some thirsty plants!
